**18) “Striving”** check one or more of the answers below that you feel are correct:

- a) A Christian need not pursue holiness because this comes naturally.
- b) A Christian must strive to be holy by putting his/her mind to it often.
- c) A Christian must not strive because that causes anxiety, and Bible says to not be anxious for anything.
- d) The Bible says to pursue holiness.
- e) The Bible says we should not strive or pursue anything because that is not trusting God for it.
- f) The Bible says we should be at peace by just resting in Jesus, no need to pursue anything.
- g) The Bible says Let us therefore strive to enter that rest so we don’t fail to enter Heaven because of disobedience, therefore we must strive for this.
- h) We should strive to keep our eyes on Jesus in faith, so that we will be able to achieve this by faith upon Him.
- i) Striving must be done right, that is by strength that comes by faith in Jesus, by patience, not by our own fleshly strength.
- j) Striving is of the devil.
- k) We need not strive against sin, just trust Jesus.

**19) “When a man and woman are dating/courting one another, before they are married”** check one or more of the answers below that you feel are correct:

- a) They can have sexual contact before they are married, because they are dating.
- b) They must not have any sexual contact before they are married.
- c) Sexual contact before marriage is called fornication and it is a sin.
- d) It is not O.K. to even look like they might be fornicating, even if they are not.
- e) Sexual contact before marriage is not a big deal or serious, as is obvious of that because many are doing it and they are fine.
- f) Sexual contact is serious and means the two become one flesh for the rest of their life.
- g) Even looking at someone of the opposite sex with lust in the heart, is like committing adultery already in their heart, thus it is a sin.
- h) Attraction to the opposite sex (men for women, and women for men) is normal Christian behavior, if kept within proper bounds.
- i) Even a guy thinking a gal is pretty is lustful and a sin.
- j) We are responsible as Christians not to even allow sinful imaginations to occur in our minds- we must resist the devil, firm in our faith in Jesus.
- k) God will not send those who are fornicators or sexually immoral to Hell to burn forever and ever.
- l) We Christians should avoid even the appearance (even looking like you might be to others) of evil, including fornication or sexual immorality.

**20) “Care of the Environment”** check one or more of the answers below that you feel are correct:

- a) When God said “Be fruitful and multiply and fill the earth and subdue it, and have dominion over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the heavens and over every living thing that moves on the earth”, in Genesis 1, He meant we were to be good stewards of the Earth.
- b) The environment of the Earth is on the brink of permanent damage because of mankind’s actions, and being our home, we must reverse this damage.
- c) As Christians, we should do our part to promote environmentalism and promote its concepts into our church, so others in the church can also know the importance of the environment of the Earth.
- d) The Earth has miraculously not been destroyed by a giant meteor or comet in it’s billions of years in existence, only to suffer it’s greatest damage from threat of advancing mankind in the last 130 years or so.
- e) We can save the Earth by using less energy, or eating less, or not eating meat.
- f) When the Bible says, “We have all become like one who is unclean, and all our righteous deeds are like a polluted garment”, this means God is concerned about the earth’s environment.
- g) Part of environmentalism carries the belief that there are too many people on the Earth, and therefore the logical conclusion of this belief ranges from first, that we must limit the amount of reproduction through birth control or other measures, to lastly, the purposeful extermination of some portion of its peoples through disease, war, or other means, and also that the value of each human being decreases as the overall world population increases, *and I agree with some or all of this belief.*
- h) Environmentalism is a human philosophy that finds antagonism with genuine Christianity.
- i) When the Bible says, “Lift up your eyes to the heavens, and look at the earth beneath; for the heavens vanish like smoke, the earth will wear out like a garment, and they who dwell in it will die in like manner”, this means, in part, that the Earth wears out with use, like clothing does.
- j) Environmentalism is a religion in its own right, whereby the Earth is the worshipped mother goddess that gives those things that live on the Earth life, which subsequently trumps the life of individual human beings in importance, even seeing those human beings that God created along with the earth and put there, as destructive parasites.



**21) “A Christian’s approach to sin done around/near them, done by non-Christians”** check one or more of the answers below that you feel are correct:

- a) When a Christians sees this, they should be troubled in their heart by this.
- b) When a Christians sees this, the Christian should confront the person doing this every time because what they are doing is wrong, so they have the opportunity to repent.
- c) When a Christian sees this, the Christians should not confront the person doing this because it is not our job as Christians to confront what is wrong.
- d) When a Christian sees this, the Christian should inquire of the Lord, as for what to do, if anything in each situation and instance because there is no pat answer for this.
- e) When a Christian sees this, all the Christian should do is pray for the person doing this.
- f) When a Christian sees this, sometimes the Christian should intervene in some way.
- g) When a Christian sees this, sometimes the Christian should *not* intervene.
- h) When a Christian sees this, the Christian should not be troubled about this because Jesus said that there would be an increase in iniquity toward the end of time.
- i) When a Christian sees this, they should be thankful that they themselves are saved, and furthermore, not be concerned with whether or not anyone else is going to perish in their sins because is up to that person sinning because they are choosing to sin.
- j) We Christians should always seek the direction of the Holy Spirit for if, what, and when we should say or do something pertaining to this.
- k) We Christians should be angry with sin and hate sin, even the clothing stained with it.

**22) “Being filled with the Holy Spirit”** check one or more of the answers below that you feel are correct:

**23) “Proper Social Justice”** check one or more of the answers below that you feel are correct:

- a) God cares about poor people.
- b) Whoever closes their ears to the cries of the poor, will himself cry and God will not hear him or help him.
- c) Remembering the poor and hurting, as a principle in the Bible, is one of the heart done voluntarily, loving your neighbor as yourself, and is to be done as privately as possible as to not be a show to men but rather done towards God.
- d) Because God cares about poor people, we should support government measures to help poor people instead of the church doing this.
- e) Social justice, in the Bible, is the government remembering the poor, so as to take from the rich and give to the poor via taxes.
- f) Social justice, in the Bible, is the church remembering the poor, especially those in the church, so those who have, give to those who don’t have, via donations.
- g) The thinking that the church should, not government or political tax measures, help poorer people, is wrong because as Christians we should support socialism.
- g) Jesus tells us that our “neighbor” is anyone that we know of that is in need, especially other Christians.

- h) Remembering the poor and hurting, as a principle in the Bible, is where a group of people are cajoled, compelled, coerced, or are otherwise *required* to contribute to the needs of the poor, because people will not give enough to the poor if it is not forced in this way.
- i) A perverted form of ‘Social Justice’ is often used today to support the human philosophy of Socialism, which is which is actually directly opposed to Christianity.
- j) Churches should be an agency of Socialism, where they work in conjunction with the government to take care of poor people, using government funding.
- k) Churches should be an agency of social justice, where the churches make offices to seek out certain wrongdoers and report them to the government.
- l) Churches should, as a collective group of Christian individuals, privately help *primarily* the poor Christians in their churches, because Christians should especially look after the welfare of their Christian brothers and sisters.
- m) Churches should as a collective group of Christian individuals, privately help *primarily* the poor of the world through the use of church ministry funds.
- n) Churches should do their work, privately separate from the government, since the churches should not be a political agency nor involved with a world government, thus church social justice is not political nor governmental.
- o) The true Church is the Body of Christ, from an eternal kingdom that is not of this world, thus it is separate and functions separately from the governments of this world, as in the world but not of it, and is personally governed by Jesus Christ as Lord and King.
- p) Even though Christians are not of this world, as being in the world, we ourselves are to oppose wickedness in the fullest way we can, such as voting (in countries that is allowed) for good, and against evil.
- q) As Christians, we should set ourselves against things that are wicked, speaking out against wickedness privately and publicly, standing up for, and promoting righteousness around us, even amongst non-Christians, as private Christian individuals who stand up for God in our community.

**24) “A Christian’s approach to sin done around/near them, done by *Christians*”** check one or more of the answers below that you feel are correct:

- a) When a Christians sees this, they should be troubled in their heart by this.
- b) When a Christians sees this, they should confront the Christian person doing this *every* time because what they are doing is wrong, so they have the opportunity to repent.
- c) When a Christian sees this, we should not confront the other Christian person doing this because it is not our job to confront other Christians with what is wrong.
- d) It depends on what is happening that is wrong. Some things must be confronted immediately, even publicly, and other things not confronted at all, or privately initially. We should follow the Bible’s guidance and pray for guidance from the Holy Spirit as to what to do.
- e) When a Christian sees this, all the Christian should do is pray for the other Christian person doing this sin.
- f) When a Christian sees this, sometimes the Christian should intervene in some way towards the other Christian.
- g) When a Christian sees this, sometimes the Christian should *not* intervene in towards the other Christian.
- h) When a Christian sees this, the Christian should not be troubled about this because Jesus said that there would be an increase in iniquity toward the end of time, and a “falling away” in the last days.
- i) When a Christian sees this, they should be thankful that they themselves are saved and not sinning, and furthermore, not be concerned whether or not the other Christian is going to perish in their sins because it is up to that person sinning, they are choosing to sin.
- j) We Christians should always seek the direction of the Holy Spirit for if, what, and when we should say or do something pertaining to this towards the other Christian.
- k) We Christians should be angry with sin and hate sin, especially that of Christians, even the clothing stained with it.

25) **“Unity in the Church”** check one or more of the answers below that you feel are correct:

- a) Unity amongst Christians is important, absolutely necessary, and must be pursued with all diligence.
- b) Lack of unity amongst Christians causes divisions in the Church, which God hates.
- c) Continued divisions can cause hard-feelings and bitterness, which is a sin that can lead to Hell.
- d) If someone in the Church wrongs us, we must only confront the wrong through a process that Jesus taught specifically, which must be followed precisely, and the ultimate consequence is expulsion of someone from the fellowship until the person who did the wrong repents publicly.
- e) A person in the fellowship who claims to be a Christian, who is living in the sin of immorality or greed, can cause wrong to be done to those in the church *who become aware of it*, even if not done to them personally, which is one reason the Bible says those who are spiritual should try to restore the sinner privately first.
- f) If someone in the Church wrongs you personally, you can just forgive the person instead of confronting them, so long as you genuinely forgive that person from your heart.
- g) Unity is so important that if someone is involved in a sin that comes to the attention of those in the church, we *must not* confront that person so that they don’t get upset with us or anyone else, thus causing hard-feelings.
- h) If a fellow Christian in the church is a lesbian or homosexual, that is not our business, that is only between them and God.
- i) If a fellow Christian is greedy or immoral, he/she must repent or be ejected from the fellowship.
- j) It is not our responsibility as a Christian to confront sin of other believers, it is the Pastor’s job.
- k) It is not our responsibility as a Christian to confront sin of other believers, it is between them and God.
- l) We should confront the sin in our own lives, repent of it, and get rid of it first, then we can deal with the sins of other Christians.
- m) “Judge not lest you be judged” is in the Bible and means that you should never judge, since you too are a sinner saved by grace.
- n) “False unity” is a demonic concept that teaches unity is more important than purity amongst Christians.
- o) Unity is accomplished by each Christian being in unity and in tune with Jesus, through the Holy Spirit, thus anything that affects our unity with Jesus, such as sin, would also affect our unity with other believers.
- p) Unity is accomplished by each of the Christians seeking the mind of the Lord on a particular matter, so it is the decision of Jesus, not just our own human opinion, and we, having the mind of Christ, can all come to agreement with Him about the matter and also with one another in this way.
- q) The Lord has provided us with those who are leaders and elders in the Lord to help with group decision making for the *group* of believers.

26) **“Being fruitful as a Christian”** check one or more of the answers below that you feel are correct:

- a) this means having and eating mangos, grapes, apples, and other fruits.
- b) this means being successful or working a job, not being lazy, making money, giving to the poor, and living a full life.
- c) not being fruitful can cause a Christian to end up cut off, and away from Christ.
- d) this means to have children with your wife/husband.
- e) this means the fruit of the Spirit.
- f) this means serving in ministry, such as a missionary, pastor, teacher, worship leader, etc.
- g) this means making converts to Christianity.
- h) this means simply being a Christian, knowing Jesus.
- i) this means the life of Jesus Christ living in and through me.
- j) this means being filled with the Holy Spirit.
- k) this means being baptized with the Holy Spirit.
- l) this means *obligatorily* helping out some poor people or orphans.
- m) this means showing signs of growth in faith towards Christ.
- n) this means feeding the sheep.
- o) this means reading your Bible and praying everyday.
- p) this means simply being a mature Christian.
- q) this means that I have been crucified with Christ, it’s no longer I who live, but Christ lives through me.
- r) this means the good things done by Christ through me as I walk by the Spirit, and not by the flesh.
- s) fruitfulness is not critically important or serious as a Christian.
- t) fruitfulness is critically important and serious as a Christian.
- u) bad fruit would be proof a person is not a real Christian, that Christ is not living through them.

27) **“Proper Self-Deprecation”** check one or more of the answers below that you feel are correct:

- a) This is not good and means you are tearing yourself down.
- b) This is good and means you are really doing well but you won't admit it.
- c) This means you are not doing well and you admit it to others.
- d) This is not good and means you won't take credit for the good things you are doing.
- e) This is not good and means you are having false humility.
- f) This is good and means you are not taking credit for the good things God is doing.
- g) This can be done wrongly and fake, and act as a mask for arrogance when you are really only thinking mostly about yourself but not admitting that to others and maybe not admitting that to yourself either.
- h) This can be done wrongly in fake humility, and can be a mask for self-pity, where you are really feeling sorry for yourself and your own situation.
- i) This can be good, not thinking too highly of yourself.
- j) This means feeling sad or depressed about your situation and self, as a Christian.
- k) Practicing this is doubting God for your life.
- l) If it is fake, it is practicing doubt towards God for your life, with a mask of false humility.
- m) This done correctly means acknowledging to yourself and to others in truth that what was good done by you was done only by the power and grace of God.
- n) This done incorrectly means you are giving God the glory for the good things done by you or the good in your life.
- o) This done correctly means you feel worthless but give God the glory for the good.

28) **“Bringing God’s Kingdom to Earth, as in the Lord’s prayer”** check one or more of the answers below that you feel are correct:

- a) This means we as Christians should setup the governments of the earth to accept Christians, church, and submit under the authority of Jesus.
- b) This means influencing or making the world politically or governmentally prepared for the return of Jesus.
- c) This means bringing *everyone in the world* to know Jesus as their personal savior, to be Christians.
- d) This means inside the hearts of those who make Jesus the Lord of their life.
- e) This means that since the Lord lives in our hearts as true born-again Christians, we take God’s Kingdom everywhere we go.
- f) This means that as we continually submit our lives to the direction of the Holy Spirit, that He will lead us to do God’s will in whatever He asks us to do, and He will influence those around us, and through us.
- g) This means bringing someone to know Jesus as their personal savior and Lord.
- h) This means giving someone poor, food, clothing, or other things they might need in the name of Jesus.
- i) This means that since Christ is in our hearts, we will be different than those around us who are in the world, bringing salt and light, God’s presence, into every situation, every decision we make, and every word we say, and to look at the world through the eyes of God.
- j) This means being soft and pliable in our minds and morals to those who are in the world, so they will think we are on their side and realize we are their friends, and by hanging out with them and learning their ways, we can influence the world.
- k) This means being pleasing others, saying things that are easy to be heard, and not correcting things that are wrong or morally wicked, we Christians can show that we love everyone and can ‘play well’ with other religions.
- l) This means finding common ground with other religions, beliefs, and philosophies of man, and focusing on these common things, and being one big loving religion whereby all people’s of the world can agree with each other.
- m) This means we serve Jesus Christ and put Him in the highest place in our minds, desires, direction, and our strength, our very hearts, making Him Lord in everything about us, loving Him more than anyone or anything, even to the point that we do and say the things of God even when others don't like it , will hate us, reject us, be offended by Jesus in our lives and words, because not offending Jesus nor denying Him before others is more important than not offending someone or anyone else.
- n) This was demonstrated by Jesus when He walked on the earth and prayed to the Father, *"I have manifested thy name unto the men which thou gavest me out of the world: thine they were, and thou gavest them me; and they have kept thy word." and "I pray for them: I pray not for the world, but for them which thou hast given me; for they are thine." and "And now I am no more in the world, but these are in the world, and I come to thee. Holy Father, keep through thine own name those whom thou hast given me, that they may be one, as we are."*

29) **“Church”** check one or more of the answers below that you feel are correct:

- a) Is a building used by a Christian religious institution for meetings and worshiping God.
- b) Is a corporation formed under government laws, for the tax exempt purpose of Christians meeting together.
- c) Is a local group organized under a denominational system, by a pastor that is licensed/ordained by that denominational system.
- d) God has *special* blessing on a local group that is formed under existing denominational systems (God blesses these), but not so much on those that are not.
- e) The pastor is the C.E.O. of this local corporation group, worshiping God, and using worldly leadership models.
- f) Is made up of every born-again Christian who is part of the body of Christ Jesus.
- g) Requires no building nor denominational system.
- h) Denominations are human institutions formed by like-believing Christians.
- i) Denominations are human institutions formed by like-believing Christians by God’s direction.
- j) Denominations are God-made institutions formed for like-believing Christians.
- k) The denomination model is the model *God* has chosen for churches to be organized under, that us Christians are to be subject to.
- l) The Acts model is the model God has chosen for churches to be organized according to, a local group of true Christians.
- m) The denominational model *is* the Acts model.
- n) The church is subject to the governance and ordinances of man (humans, human governments).
- o) The church, being spiritual, is only subject to the governance and leading of Jesus, the Head of the Church, through the actual presence of the Holy Ghost, it is not subject to human government.
- p) A church can be “when 2 or 3 are gathered in My Name, there I am in their midst.”
- q) A church group should only be formed by the direction, leading and will of the Holy Spirit, not by man’s will or desires.
- q) We are members of the body of Christ, members not by the will of a pastor/teacher/man/organization, but by being born-again of the Spirit, members of one another through Christ (vertically through Jesus, not horizontally through the flesh/location/proximity/human organizations).

30) **“Church Leadership”** check one or more of the answers below that you feel are correct:

- a) A pastor or teacher can only called to preach/teach by God Himself, not by man nor man’s will.
- b) A person can become a pastor or teacher by attending a proper school of biblical instruction (a Bible school) and passing their course of study.
- c) A person can become a pastor or teacher by being accepted as such by their denominational system, whether or not that person is called by God to do so.
- d) A pastor/teacher is to lead by his own logic, intelligence, and human training.
- d) A pastor/teacher is to lead by his own logic, intelligence, and human training, as long as he uses the Bible.
- e) A pastor/teacher is to lead *only* by the direction and guidance of the Holy Ghost in all he does, and will never contradict Scripture, he must be taught by the Holy Ghost.

- h) The pastor is the C.E.O. of this local corporation group, using worldly leadership models.
- h) True Christian pastors/teachers/leaders should never exercise authority in the same way as those of the world do, Jesus condemned this as He taught His disciples while washing their feet. Thus, worldly leadership models should never be used in the church, as these are not from God.
- i) Women *generally* may exercise authority over the men of the church if they carry the title of pastor, teacher, or other church leader. It is proper according to Scriptures.
- j) Women *generally* may exercise authority over the men of the church if they operate under the authority of a head pastor that is man. It is proper according to Scriptures.
- k) Women *generally* may be leaders in the church that *do not* exercise authority over the men of the church, such as deaconesses, if they operate under the authority of a pastor/leader that is man. This is proper according to Scriptures.
- l) Women *generally* may *not* exercise authority over the men of the church even if they carry the title of pastor, teacher, or other church leader. This would be improper according to Scriptures.
- m) *Generally*, women being in positions exercising authority over the men of the church is a sign/symptom that something is wrong in the church.
- n) *Generally*, women being in positions exercising authority over the men of the church is a sign/symptom that the church is finally modernizing and realizing that women too can be in leadership over men also in the church, is a sign of a healthy church.

**31) “Use of Psychology/Psychiatry/Psychological Principles amongst Christians”** check one or more of the answers below that you feel are correct:

- a) Psychological principles are valid and scientific, useful amongst Christians for how to live, think, behave, and help our mind, mentations, and attitudes.
- b) Psychological principles are a man’s philosophy that the Bible warns us strongly to avoid in Colossians 2, and only God and His Word should tell us how to live, think, behave, help our mind, mentations, and attitudes.
- c) Psychology and psychological principles may have their place in sermons and teachings amongst Christians.
- d) Psychology and psychological principles may should not have their place in sermons and teachings amongst Christians.
- e) Christians may need to seek the help of Psychologists or Psychiatrists for their mental health.
- f) Christians should never seek the help of Psychologists or Psychiatrists for their mental health, but rather go to God for this help.
- g) Christians may use the services of non-christian counselors to help them solve their mental and social problems.
- h) Christians should never seek worldly, non-christian counselors for help. They should only seek the counsel of a Christian counselor or pastor should this be necessary.
- i) Pastors and Christians counselors should be taught psychological techniques and training, so they can help other Christians with their mental health issues.
- j) Christian counselors are the same as non-christian counselors, except they are Christians, they use much the same techniques and principles as each other, but different advice.
- k) Christian counselors are not at all the same as non-christian counselors, they operate by the direction and leading of the Holy Ghost, they are “those who are spiritual”, they don’t use psychological techniques or principles.
- l) Christians may attend worldly, non-christian support “group” or groups for mental and emotional help and support.
- m) Christians should never seek mental or emotional support from worldly/non-christian support groups, since “what fellowship does light have with darkness”.

**32) “Use of Anti-depressants/Anti-psychotic meds for fear/anxiety/depression amongst Christians”** check one or more of the answers below that you feel are correct:

- a) Christians may rely upon these meds for their mental well-being as long as they are prescribed by a physician.
- b) Christians should never rely on anything but Jesus for their mental well-being.
- c) It is OK for a Christian to take these meds if they become depressed.
- d) Christians should not take these meds for depression, but rather commit themselves to the Lord’s keeping.
- e) Modern science is very knowledgeable about the brain’s chemistry and what is needed to keep it functioning well.
- f) Modern science has a very limited knowledge of the human brain and it’s complex makeup and chemistry, its ramifications, and should not be monkeying with it. Christians should trust the Lord to help their mind, since the Bible speaks of God “renewing our mind”.
- g) God takes good care of those who are His.
- h) God uses modern science, via Psychologists and Psychiatrists to take care of those who are His.
- i) God’s presence inside of the Christian who is right with God will bring true well-being and peace.
- j) God commands us in Scripture, not to give place to anxiety, but rather by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, make our requests be made unto God. And the peace of God, which passes all understanding, will keep our hearts and minds through Christ Jesus. Therefore, Psychologists and Psychiatrists are for those who do not have Jesus in their hearts, those who are not right with God.

33) **“Worship of God”** check one or more of the answers below that you feel are correct:

- a) All human beings worship something/someone. None worship nothing or no one- *everyone* worships.
- b) Whoever/whatever we submit ourselves to, it is to that which we are servants to obey.
- c) Worship of God is more than a song, more than on Sundays, more than in a group, it is our whole life, every single part, all the time, as a living sacrifice unto Him in obedience and love for Him, and Him alone.
- d) We can worship God by any way or means we want to.
- e) We may only worship God by the way and means that God says to.
- f) We may worship God in order to feel better or to get something from Him (like ‘giving to get’).
- g) God likes it when we worship Him using rote methods and lots of repetition.
- h) God likes it when we worship Him from our heart, in Spirit and in truth.
- i) True worship of God is all about God, He alone as the focus, not about ourselves, not focused on ourselves or our feelings, or what we can get, but is offered unreservedly unto God from my heart, as it is rightfully due Him, regardless of myself, my situation, or my feelings.
- j) Fake worship of God would be man-centered, self-centered, or ‘how-I-feel’ based, while *calling* it worship of God.
- k) Fake worship of God would be worshiping God with all my heart, soul, strength, and mind.
- l) Fake worship of God may also be worshiping God with my lips, while my heart is far from Him.
- m) Fake worship of God is idolatry, that is, esteeming something or fearing something/someone who is not God (such as man), *while saying* I serve God.
- n) Fake worship of God would be living in sin, while saying or acting like I serve God, that I’m a Christian.
- o) Fake worship of God might try to emulate the real thing by using droning tones and repetitive lyrics in songs to induce a hypnotic effect upon one’s self or a group meeting for worship of God.
- p) Fake worship of God is calling Jesus “Lord”, yet not fully obeying His Word, His commands, His direction.
- q) Fake worship of God can be done in a church setting, and even promoted by its leadership.
- r) God hates fake worship.
- s) God accepts fake worship, as long as it *looks* like real worship to everyone, even if it isn’t God at the center/focus of the worship or the worshipers are living in sin/disobedience to Him.
- t) Fake worship of God holds Him as highest revered, above all that exists or will exist, honoring Him, and loving Him in Spirit and in truth.
- u) Worshiping God in Spirit means everyone being on the same page, same purpose, or that we are lively while doing it.
- v) Worshiping God in Spirit means we are one with God by the Holy Spirit indwelling us, following His leading and direction, having His mind. Everyone else that is also one with God by the Holy Spirit is also of the same Spirit, same mind, resulting in corporate/group worship of God.
- w) Those who do not have the Holy Spirit indwelling them, but instead some sensual spirit, are not of God, and cannot truly worship God in Spirit and in truth- these also are fake worshipers of God.
